2018 Hopi Code Talkers Recognition Day SAVE THE DATE - April 27, 2018

Veterans, Families and General Public are invited to attend this year's Hopi Code Talkers Recognition Day scheduled for April 27, 2018, at the Hopi Veterans Memorial Center, near Kykotsmovi, AZ. Registration will begin at 9:00 a.m. and the event will commence from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. (MST). The keynote speaker this year will be Mr. Leigh Kuwanwisiwma, Director Emeritus, recently retired from the Hopi Cultural Preservation Office. Additionally, the event will highlight and recognize Perry Honani as this year's featured Hopi Code Talker.

Every year on or near April 23rd, Hopi Code Talkers Recognition Day is set aside to honor the ten Hopi Code Talkers who served during World War II in the Pacific theater. Using the Hopi lavayii (language), they transmitted secret coded radio messages to one another during combat operations. Their military actions helped turned the tide of war, saved countless lives of American soldiers and contributed to winning the war in the Pacific. Their secret communication exploits were kept secret until the late 1960's when the code talker operations were declassified.

Through the years, Hopi Code Talkers and other Native American Code Talkers have been honored and recognized by state, federal and tribal governments. On March 21, 2012, Hopi Tribal Resolution H-041-2012, established April 23rd of each year as *"Hopi Code Talkers Recognition Day"*. Finally on November 20, 2013, as the result of the Code Talkers Recognition Act of 2008 (Public Law 110-420), signed into law by President George W. Bush, 33 tribes including the ten Hopi Code Talkers, were honored during a ceremony in Washington, D.C., at the U.S. Capitol Visitor Center. A Congressional Gold Medal, designed as distinct for the Hopi Tribe was presented to then Chairman Leroy Shingoitewa, with silver duplicates awarded to the individual code talkers or their next-of-kin. Family members from each of the ten Hopi Code Talkers were represented at the prestigious Gold Medal ceremony, and also when the silver medals were bestowed to them during a separate ceremony at the National Museum of the American Indian.

So mark April 27th on your calendar to attend the event to celebrate the Hopi Code Talkers legacy and the importance of speaking Hopi lavayii today. Along with the speakers, a meal will be provided; entertainment and several interactive booths for the youth will be held at the event. Additionally, Hopi Diabetes Program will recognize the Hopi Code Talkers during their 100-Mile Run/Walk event on April 18, 2018, at the Hopi Mission School area.
