



NEWS FROM AUSTRALIA

We received email from Jon Joubert of Largs Bay, Adelaide, reporting that over the past 5-6 years he has made four trips to Fenton Airfield in the Northern Territory. He wanted our members to know that the airfield is still in very good order and still quite landable in a sizeable aircraft. Mr. Joubert notes that there is still a lot of bits and pieces of our damaged aircraft still in what was the aircraft graveyard; in fact, the entrance is marked by the tail and part of the elevator of a B-24. There is a map erected near the crossover taxiway halfway along the strip to show visitors where the graveyard is situated. In addition, at the campsite the plaque that was erected at the corner of the Officers Recreation Club was still in good order the last time he was there. 





Lackland AFB, Graduation Ceremony, 11/9








Randolph Air Force Base, November 10


